

# Executive Summary

## Saskatchewan 2026: Cancer Innovation, Equity & Integrated Care Conference

November 27 – November 29, 2026 | Saskatchewan, Canada

The AHDCC Health Equity, Cancer & Chronic Disease Innovation Conference 2026 is a high-impact, interdisciplinary forum dedicated to advancing innovation, health equity, and integrated care across Canada's health systems. Hosted by the Association Hypertension Diabetes Cancer in Canada (AHDCC), this inaugural conference will convene researchers, clinicians, policymakers, health system leaders, industry partners, trainees, and community stakeholders to address the growing and interconnected burden of cancer, diabetes, and hypertension.

These conditions frequently coexist, share underlying biological mechanisms, and are influenced by common social determinants of health. Vulnerable populations—including rural communities, Indigenous peoples, racialized groups, and individuals facing socioeconomic barriers—experience disproportionate challenges in prevention, access to care, and outcomes. Despite major advances in biomedical science, gaps remain in research translation, multimorbidity management, and equitable health system delivery.

This conference positions innovation within a systems-oriented and equity-driven framework. It aims to bridge scientific discovery and real-world implementation by fostering interdisciplinary collaboration across biomedical research, clinical practice, public health, and policy domains. Program elements will include keynote lectures, translational research panels, policy roundtables, trainee presentations, and community-engaged discussions focused on actionable solutions.

**Key objectives** include showcasing cutting-edge research in oncology and chronic disease science; strengthening translational pathways from bench to bedside; advancing integrated care models for multimorbidity; promoting equity-informed approaches to prevention, screening, treatment, and survivorship; supporting trainee development; and facilitating cross-sector dialogue that informs evidence-based policy and health system reform.

**Expected outcomes** include the development of new interdisciplinary research partnerships, strengthened collaboration between academic and policy stakeholders, enhanced knowledge mobilization strategies, increased trainee engagement in equity-oriented research, and actionable recommendations to improve integrated chronic disease care across Canada.

The AHDCC Health Equity, Cancer & Chronic Disease Innovation Conference 2026 represents a strategic opportunity to advance research-informed, equitable, and sustainable solutions that improve outcomes for individuals affected by cancer, diabetes, and hypertension nationwide.
